## Long Beach Desalination Featured on Huell Howser's California Water Series

LONG BEACH, CA – The Long Beach Seawater Desalination Research and Development Facility will be featured on an upcoming Huell Howser television series, entitled [\*California's Water\*](#). The show, which features Desalination, will air in November.

*California's Water* is a multi-part series for public television produced by Huell Howser and underwritten by members of the Association of California Water Agencies. The series explores California's water resources and the complex system of natural and man-made features that has allowed growing communities, businesses, productive farms and ecosystems to co-exist in a state that receives little or no rain for months at a time.



The series introduces viewers to California's water system and highlights key aspects of water management today, from water storage and water recycling to the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta and the Colorado River.

The [Long Beach Seawater Desalination Research and Development Facility](#) is the largest project of its kind in the United States, aimed at reducing the operational and environmental costs of full-scale desalination of seawater. Construction of the facility and subsequent research and development activity is done in partnership with the United States Department of Interior, Bureau of Reclamation; California Department of Water Resources and the Los Angeles Department of Water & Power.
